A street play is set on the subject and near about 150 performances were organized in the province of Ichalkaranji. Campus of the college and slum area the students were actively participated along with other NGOS and they worked in the same area. The people of the area were made acquainted with the serious problems of the dirtiness and pollutions. The people of
 - the area also got actively participated in the task.
- 5) Problems Encountered The students of our college are earners. After the duty hours and holidays they could go for the campaign. The people were unaware about their conditions. The students tried to make them aware about the cleanliness.
- 6) Evidence o success Communication with the people and active participation of the students got a success. They are ready to keep their area clean and non-polluted. Most of them stopped open defecation by using 'Pay and Use' toilets. Some of them owned the toilets with the assistance of the govt. schemes.
